

Sailing Update

Yes, the Flying Scots raced today (Sat, May 28)!!

Thanks to a break between early morning rain and the rain starting again around 2pm we ran three races. A huge 'Thank You' to our Race Committee, all first timers, for setting us up. Aubrey and Jan Vaughn provided the Committee Boat, AIPepe a n d Jack Greenshields worked the flags and horns. First place went to Miss Molly with Marty Otten and Jack Singleton, second to Sorokada with Demetri Telionis, Jeff Drechsler and Deb Pepe aboard and third was Cameron Henderson and Morris Young in Cameron's boat. The wind was brisk at times but not overwhelming and a great time was had by all. We're hoping for more boats next weekend.

News about dockage at Palmetto Bay Marina (PBM). Due to the efforts of John Lang, Sonny Compher and others, we now have an agreement with PBM. Sonny has written an informal review of our agreement.

Sonny met with Suzanne Thompson, property manager of Palmetto Bay Marina last week. The price for members to dock at Palmetto Bay Marina will be \$14. per ft per month, with no minimum size boat at our designated dock. The regular price is \$15. per ft per month with a 25' minimum.

If a member wants to rent monthly space not at our designated dock the price will be \$14.50 with no minimum. They will bill us on the 27th and expect payment by the 10th. They will take cash, check, credit card or you may set up an auto pay account with them which will paid on the 5th.

We can keep one club Scot in the water full time for members to use at any time which the club will pay for m o n t h l y, w h i c h t h e Commodore has agreed too.

Sonny also met with Carl Sylvester, the dock manager today. He has agreed to give us back the dock we were using and if that area which is 50 ft. fills up, we use the smaller dock just west of that one which is 40' long and is not being used. They will only bill us for the space being used at \$14. per ft. per month, boat size only, he will not add for motor or bow sprit. also can put a kayak rack on the small dock at no charge for use by members. We have to provide that rack and kayaks.

The slips may be used as needed, you just have to pay for the monthly dockage if you leave your boat in the water."


Another Opportunity to Sail
