### Good news from the Flying Scot Fleet Fleet 134 – YCHHI by Henry Schultz



Our fleet got together after the Spring Race Series to review what we are doing right and how to continue building on the good. Our talk lead us to a few changes that we believe will strengthen our fleet and be beneficial to our yacht club and members.

1. Races will once again be scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, Sometimes going back to the old way of doing things is the best way to move forward and that is what we are doing. The first start on both Saturday and Sunday is 11:00 am. This change will give us two days of racing with only one launch. The cost for docking a Scot is \$8.89 at Palmetto Bay Marina for YCHHI members.

If you choose to use the marina you are responsible for the payment.

2. A minimum of two Flying Scots are needed to qualify as a race. This change will improve the percentage of scheduled races that are completed. 3. The Calibogue Cup and Harbor Town Cup are now part of our Fall Series, and scores will be used in determining the overall Fall Series outcome. Entrance fees are the responsibility of each boat.

4. Each Fall Series weekend will also be scored as a standalone regatta and will have awards. One throw out for every five races completed per weekend. Throw outs will then be recalculated for the series to ensure we all get the best score possible by the rules.
