

The goals of all thee thrusts are laudable. 1) let's eliminate the club's mortgage debt; 2) let's assure that we have adequate funds set aside to address anticipated future capital expenditures; and 3) let's upgrade our current clubhouse infrastructure.

Balancing how we allocate funds among those three goals is the burden that you have entrusted to your Board of Stewards. I assure you that we take that burden seriously, and we will continually address it in the coming months. We earnestly solicit your input on these thrusts:

Whatever it takes, your Board of Stewards wants to take our club forward. Help us do so.
