

I'm sure you know where I'm going. Five times this year a call has gone out to members to help better the club. First, an outside work day to remove the



Dave spent his life in service to his country and his community. commissioned into the U.S. Air force in 1967, serving at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base and the Pentagon until his separation from Active duty in Dave subsequently joined the Air Force Reserves, serving as the Public Affairs Officer at Grissom AFB and subsequently accepted an assignment to the Secretary of the Air Force, Office of Public Affairs until his retirement in 1993 as a Lieutenant Colonel. In his retirement, Dave served in various roles including development director and funding executive for foundations and non-profit organizations and as a Board member of the National Association of Fundraising Burial services will be held at the Executives.
