With the government shut down the Coast Guard falls under Homeland Security did not receive their pay on the 15th of January, and may not any time soon. We are attempting to help the 175 local Coast Guardsmen in the Savannah area. They are located at Station Tybee, the MSU Unit in downtown Savannah and the Air Station located at Hunter Army Airfield. Jim Vaughn Fleet Captain Flying Scots Flying Scot Fleet 134 held a meeting at the YCHHI on 1-19-19. Also invited and attending where officers from YCHHI and anyone interested in small boat sailing and race committee. Approximately 20 people attend including 5 of the 7 active Flying Scot skippers, the Commodore, Vice Commodore, and PHRF fleet captain(s) of YCHHI.

The meeting agenda along with this summary of the meeting is being emailed all attending the meeting and all other FS fleet members.

The meeting was moderated by Jim Vaughn FS3428 and 2018 fleet captain

The meeting began at noon. The first order of business was introduction s and getting the pizza ordered!

The second order of business was to present an engraved Julip cup to the winner of the 2018 Ed Gibbs Trophy John Singleton. John acknowledges his crew, both his children, and to help provided by Hap Todd and Henry Schultz in getting the white YC Scot in condition race this fall. Another special trophy, another engraved julip cup was presented in absentia to Cameron Henderson as recognition of lifetime achievement and support of the Fleet 134.

Jim made note of the entire item on the agenda and asked that there be free discussion on the agenda items and any other item that any of the attendees wished to discuss.

Jim Vaughn Fleet Captain Flying Scots All the items on the agenda were discussed and all attending skippers spoke.

Jim started the discussion by announcing the he is due for knee(s) surgery in March and will be unavailable to sail or help organize fleet racing this spring

There was a majority of skippers present but no formal votes were taken

However consensus was voiced of and/or for the following:

- Current active skippers attending were, Jim Vaughn 3428, Henry Schultz 4920, Marty Otten 1983, Norm Shotz YCHHI blue, John Singleton YCHHI white
- Other skippers acknowledged as active but not attending are Cameron Henderson 193 and Demetri Telionis 2680
- Hap Todd and Norm Shotz are taking responsibility for the white and red YCHHI boats respectively
- Marty Otten(Miss Molly) will be off HHI from the third week of June to the second week in October
- No races are yet scheduled for the spring but John Singleton will act as point of contact with other fleet members to try to schedule spring racing
- South Carolina YC is holding a spring race May 4&5 and the FS fleet will count these races towards the Gibb trophy if at least 3 FS participate
- A fall race schedule will not be established until at least summer time to allow fleet members and RC more flexibility and participation in scheduling fall races.
- There was discussion about race committee for both FS and large boat races and the need for both. Attendees, Al Pepe, Aubrey Vaughn and Deb Pepe were noted as possible RC members for spring racing.
- There was constructive discussion of ways to get additional participation in sailing in general and FS sailing particularly
- Mark Dryden, Wexford Harbor Master, indicated that Wexford is again willing to work with YCHHI on staging at Wexford Harbor between races. He also request for one FS for Wexford's junior sailing program again this summer and 3428 was volunteered for that purpose. Mark also will work with YCHHI members to have access to that boat for day sailing use while it is at Wexford
- In between discussions pizza was enjoyed. Soft drinks were provided courtesy of YCHHI. \$64 was donated for the pizza which cost \$39.00. The overage will be used to offset some of the cost of engraving of the2018 FS trophies

The meeting was adjourned at around 2pm
