Celebration!

For the remainder of the year, The Main Sheet will have a dedicated section celebrating the 50th anniversary of the club. A multi-part history of the club as well as photos, celebration events and activities will be posted here.

Part 1: Early History

Founding of the The Hilton Head Sailing Club followed the first successful running of the Harbour Town cup in 1970. It was started in 1971 by "a small group of dedicated sailors." Bob Scott, the first commodore is pictured on the far right.

In the years from 1971 to the building of the club house the club was described by some as a "traveling crap game" moving from location to location for meetings



and events. Meetings were often in Harbour Town under the Liberty Oak or in meeting rooms over the shops. Many of the parties were at the Harbour Town clubhouse. But even without a clubhouse the membership was very active. In 1971 they established the Calibogue Cup and registered the burgee with Lloyds of London. In 1972 they started racing 470 and had 10 in the fleet. In 1974 they established the McAless trophy for contributions to sailing, and in 1975 they hosted the National Lighting championships and founded the Coolidge trophy for sailing achievement. In 1976 they brought a second national regatta to HHI and started a cruising fleet.



The year 1977 brought the name change to The Yacht Club of Hilton Head Island. This was in an effort to broaden the membership and they now accepted POWER BOATERS! That year also saw the participation trophy added to the club.

In 1978 the property was bought for the club house. By then the membership had reached 150 active members!

Eleven years ago our YC presented to the Russells the idea of using YC member boats to take the visiting hero families out onto the waters of Hilton Head Island for private time and give them a truly unique experience not readily available to the public. Our involvement has grown into what is reported to be the favorite activity by the families who meet our skippers.

I want to give the membership a sampling of comments that the skippers receive from almost every trip. Ernie and Terri Ahr have been involved with the program from the beginning. Ernie was not recruited to help, Ernie came to me and asked if he could be part of the program. With the help of Terri, the Ahrs give a warm family friendly boat trip by treating the family like they were the kids and the grandkids. Ernie and Terri took out the third visiting family of this year, and the following is part of the thank you note send to them after the family got home, along with a photo to the hero child, her brother and the Ahrs. Ernie and Terri haven't even seen this thank you card yet, they are mailed to me as I'm the address of record.

Our family participated in the private boat tour through Hilton Head Heroes. Our daughter, Marett (I2) finished treatments for leukemia in January. We all had so much fun out on the boat with Ernie and Terri. It was the highlight of our trip! They were both very knowledgeable about the area. The kids enjoyed driving the boat too! It was perfect from beginning to end. Thank you to all involved to provide this free of charge for the families. We are grateful to have been given the opportunity to see beautiful Hilton Head Island from the water. Thank you all for your kindness!


Dock Project - Status Report 30 June 2021

Construction of the first two 12'x12' dock sections has been substantially completed, including temporary joining of the two sections to prepare for their joining on the water. Remaining to be done are the final inspection and tightening of all fasteners, installation of chain retainers and cleats, separation of the two sections, and installation of eight floats on each section.

We will construct platforms for the two large boat trailers that will carry the sections to the Cross Island Dock and launch them.

The helix anchors, chain and associated hardware have been procured by the divers who will install them when they receive our go ahead.

After the anchoring system is installed, the next step will be the flipping over and mounting of each dock section on a boat trailer by a hired crane, loose layout of the decking (not screwed down - to provide for later access to the joining hardware), the move to the Cross Island ramp, and the launching and securing at the anchor site. The two sections will then be bolted together to form a 12' x 24' dock, the decking will be secured and dock lights will be installed.



Recently, Sonny Compher received a call from DHEC and was informed that they believe that a permit is required for us "to launch" the dock. We are currently awaiting the availability of the permitting personnel for a meeting to discuss the matter. It is our belief that a permit is not required for our project, and we hope to convince them of that.

Except for completion of the construction of the two dock sections and the trailer platforms, the next project steps are on hold awaiting resolution of the permitting question with DHEC-OHMC. If they conclude that permitting is required, then the application process may consume one or more months. In that case, a possible stop gap measure is being considered wherein the anchoring system could be installed and be used temporarily to provide moorings for up to four Flying Scots.
