Following Wine M * * •

What's the best temperature for serving wine?

When it come to serving wine Goldilocks would say the temperature should be "just right" and she would be correct. Too hot and the wine's alcohol will be emphasized leaving it tasting flat. Too cold and the aromas and flavors will be muted. When a red wine is served too cold the tannins can seem harsh and astringent. Too often white wines will be served right out of the refrigerator while reds are opened at a "too warm" room temperature. Neither of these are ideal. Of course, what is "just right" is a matter of individual taste but there are some general guidelines.

LIGHT DRY WHITE WINES, ROSES AND SPARKLING WINES. These taste best when served at 40 to 50 degrees F. This preserves their freshness and fruitiness. Think crisp Pinot Grigio and Champagne. Chilling keeps the bubbles in sparklers fine rather than frothy. This is also a good range for dessert wines for at warmer temperatures their sweetness is accentuated, while chilling them preserves their balance without squashing their vibrant aromas.

FULL BODIED WHITE WINES AND LIGHT FRUITY REDS. A range of 50 to 60 degrees F will pick up more of the complexity and aromatics of say, a rich Chardonnay and will make a fruity Beaujolais more refreshing.

FULL BODIED RED WINES AND PORTS. These have a narrower range of 60 to 65 degrees F. Cooler than most room temperatures but warmer than what is considered the "ideal" cellaring temperature. The warmer temperatures make the tannins in powerful Cabernet Sauvignons or Syrahs appear more subtle and helps to de-emphasize their bitter components. So experiment, it's not an exact science. Take your whites out of the refrigerator 10 to 15 minutes before serving. If you cellar, remove your reds at least 30 to 60 minutes early. Open or maybe even decant them and see if you notice a difference. But most of all just enjoy!


