Per Chapman's <u>Piloting</u>, <u>Seamanship and Small Boat Handling</u> "A burgee is a triangular, rectangular, or swallow tail flag usually denoting a yacht club or similar unit membership."

When one walks into our clubhouse, arguably its most striking feature is the collection of flags and burgees arrayed on the upper part of all the walls and the beams. These are predominately burgees from other yacht clubs but there is also a few owner's burgees and at least one officer's flag. Each club burgee was donated by a member who visited The YCHHI or brought back from a yacht club that was visited by one of our members with which they exchanged burgees. The display includes burgees from around this county and around the world. Deb Pepe is just finishing a project that updates our book on the identification of these burgees. She should have that done by the end of this year. Thanks Deb!

How our burgee came to be?


In 1972 The Hilton Head Sailing Club, predecessor of The YCHHI, held a competition for the design of a burgee. The completion was won by Robert (Bob) Stafford who was then secretary of the Sailing Club. It was adopted by the membership in 1972 and by 1973 was registered with Lloyds Registry. The importance of this symbol to our club is acknowledged in the Article I, section one of The YCHHI By Laws which describes our burgee in great detail (15 lines!) but I think the image above is enough for this article! However current membership should know the protocol for displaying the burgee which is in Section 2 of Article I. "The burgee is authorized to be displayed from any craft not racing and under the command of a Club member in good standing. When displayed, the burgee will be flown as prescribed in the current edition of Chapman's Piloting, Seamanship and Small Boat Handling...."

Officer Flags

The flags below are not specific to The YCHHI but can be flown by any serving YCHHI officer the Past Commodore same manner as our burgee.

They are in order from left to right.

First row: Commodore, Rear Commodore, Vice Commodore, Second row; Secretary, Treasurer, and Past Commodore



Other nautical flags

For those who served in the Navy of any nation or Coast Guard you already know there is a set of flags that represent each letter of the alphabet, the numbers 1-10 and a first, second and third repeater flags. These flags were used before the days of radio and Morris Code and are still can be used today in sailing races and regattas. In addition to representing a letter, many signal flags have a meaning if flown alone. One example of this is the solid yellow flag. Besides being the letter Q it is also the Quarantine flag. Sadly this flag was flown often in many places around the world in 2020!

National flags (Ensign)

Many boats also fly their country's flag often referred to as an Ensign on their boats. There a conventions on the style and placement of these flags on each type boat. You can get the answer most flag etiquette in Chapman's. If you don't have a copy there are a couple copies at your club.

Dock Progress Update

WE ARE getting there! The dock is now positioned to enable access by the Marina Yard's big rig, which will do the launching.

Just to make things a little harder, the 2"x8"x12' decking boards are all slightly over 12' long by 0.5" to 0.7", and each one must be cut to fit. BUT - the end is in sight!

The decking boards you see are not screwed down yet - they're just sized and laid in, ready for spacing and securing. Another day or so.....

The dock will be launched then moved to the north side of the Marina and attached there to provide a surface for the kayaks and canoes that the marina rents out. The marina is buying the dock from us for that purpose.
