

We're certainly going to miss Jan & Aubrey Vaughan, who are moving to Annapolis, MD on February 4.



# Chasing Venus '21 Sauvignon Blanc New Zealand-Marlborough

Does this wine embolden men from Mars to chase women from Venus? No, that is not how this wine from the McLean vineyards in the of Marlborough got its name. 'Twas 1769 when Captain Cook took command of the HMS Endeavor. On board we're several

astronomers whose publicized mission was to study and chart the passage of Venus as it crossed the sun. What was not made known was the British had commissioned Cook to find the "Southern Continent". Both missions were successful. Marlborough is renowned through out the wine world for producing award winning Sauvignon Blanc. A dry sunny region, cooler than Australia, with wide fluctuations between day and night temperatures. This and stony well

draining soils support a perfect balance between berry ripeness and acidity making the wines distinctly different from Australian wines. The wines are made in a wide range of styles but are loved for their pungent aromatic character, notes of exotic tropical fruits and dry minerality.

Color: Bright, light straw Body: Medium-Full

Aroma: Bold citrus with herbal & lime notes

Taste: Rich, crisp & clean. Citrus, mango & pineapple

Finish: Lively, long & clean, no oak.

# Gerard Bertrand '20 Cote des Roses France-Languedoc

Rose wines are made only from red grapes. In France it is one of the oldest types produced. The depth of color is determined by the grape varietals and how long the juice intermingles with the skins. Because skin contact is short few tannins are absorbed. As opposed to blush wines which are a blending of red & white wines. Rose wines can be sweet, dry or somewhere in between.

Old World Rose are almost always dry, where the ones from the New World tend to be sweeter but that is changing. The best Rose are bold, fruity and have substantial body. This wine is a blending of Grenache, Cinsault and Sarah. The bottle design was created during a competition among design students in Paris. The bottle bottom is cut into the shape of an open rose while the top has an elegant glass stopper. Offer this wine instead of a long stemmed rose this Valentine's Day. Other occasions on which to enjoy a Rose would be: when she wants white and he wants red, with pork or Asian dishes, to celebrate spring, summer, the completion of our new deck or any happy event.

# Love Noir '19 Pinot Noir California-Livermore

Pinot Noir grapes are thin skinned, finicky and temperamental. They are highly reflective of the environment in which they are grown. They like warm days and cool nights which California provides. Some affordable Pinot Noirs can be too thin, too lite and/or too acidic. Love Noir is medium bodied, smooth and velvety. It's an easy drinker, alone or accompanying food. The fruit is front and center with a rich robust layered structure. Generous notes of dark cherry and black berries, rich espresso and hints of vanilla. It won a silver medal in the San Francisco wine competition.

Aroma: Cherries, strawberries & cranberries

Taste: Fruit forward with dark fruits, coffee & hints of toasted oak

Finish: Dry, balanced and silky smooth
