The Big Move

On June 3rd the Dickie's successfully moved Salacia, their 1999 Catalina 320, from Norfolk, VA to its new home at Skull Creek Marina on Hilton Head Island. This 501.4 nautical mile (NM) journey took 22 days. They averaged 33 nautical miles (NMs) a day and were on the water for an average of 6 hours a day. With the exception of the last day, the entire trip was on the Intracoastal Waterway (ICW). The voyage was broken up into three sections to accommodate crew swaps. James and his son William did the entire trip. The first leg (168.7 NMs) was accompanied by James's friend, neighbor, and sailing mentor John Fitzwilliam. The second leg (147.3 NMs) was accompanied by yacht club members Babs Erny and Julie Traylor. Beth Ann Dickie and our dog Lula joined us for the final leg (185.4 NMs).



The trip itself was rather routine. The ICW was narrow and sea state was not an issue. This allowed for reasonable morning departure times and we were tied up at a marina by early evening. The relative ease of each day's travels permitted everyone to get to know each other better. Sea stories became animated tales of battles with Neptune, other boaters on a lake, or even the language used when one runs aground. Everyone became quickly acclimated with Salacia and what needed to be done to enter or leave the marina. There was time to read, sightsee, and even nap.



We learned a lot as well. We learned to rig port and starboard sides when entering a marina, just in case

there is a last-minute change. We also learned that Julie will take all of your money playing Texas Hold 'Em. Babs excels at any position on the boat. William will eat a big lunch then work out, which he did every day. I will manage to stress out and worry even when everything was going perfectly.

The trip was a success. Each member of the crew had an enjoyable adventure. We are glad to finally have Salacia here in Hilton Head Island. We are looking forward to new adventures in

the low country and sharing that time on the water with members from the club. -James Dickie
