



# From the Helm



Last month we discussed the Pan-Pan radio call. This month we will finish the three types of calls with the Securite call.

Securite is used as a safety broadcast to provide important navigational or meteorological warning to transmit. All stations hearing the safety broadcast should listen to the safety message until they are able to determine if it impacts their safety while on the water.

A Securite call is initiated by transmitting on Channel 16 by repeating three times "Securite, Securite, Securite." It is followed by the name of the vessel, position, nature of the issue, and any other relevant information. Example:

- Securite, Securite, Securite
- This is sailing vessel Salacia
- There are multiple containers adrift in Position 31 degrees 57.921 N, 80 degrees 43.526 W, vicinity of Savannah River Entrance buoy 9SE and are drifting in a South-Easterly direction.

Remember to speak slowly and clearly. Repeat this information as you feel necessary. You may be contacted by the US Coast Guard or other boaters to provide additional information.


